
How Apple Juice is Produced and Distributed

Watch the "How Apple Juice is Made" video. Use it to number these 12 steps in the correct sequence.

Some of the juice is stored in giant containers in a sterile warehouse.
 Apples are chopped up into little pieces in the grinder.
The juice is pasturized by heating it up.
Consumers can enjoy apple juice at any time of year.
Macintosh apples are harvested in October.
The apple pieces are squeezed in a hydraulic press.
The juice is filtered a final time.
Apples are inspected, and the leaves are separated from the apples.
Apple juice containers are filled and sealed.
 Apples are washed, which also takes out pebbles that were picked up with apples that had fallen on the ground.
Filters separate the juice from the solid apple parts.
Bottles are shipped all over the United States.





How Orange Juice is Produced and Distributed

 Some of the pulp is added back into the juice.
 Orange juice is poured into cartons.
 Oranges are sorted by size.
 Tasters check the quality of the orange juice.
 Oranges are washed out of the trucks.
 Orange juice is shipped all over the United States using trains and trucks.
 Oranges are pressed onto metal prongs to squeeze out the juice.
 Trucks bring the oranges to an orange juice processing plant.
 Lots of rain and sunshine help oranges and other citrus fruits grow.
 Everyone can enjoy drinking orange juice.
 Oranges are harvested in Florida. (Different varieties ripen at different times of year.)
