- colored
- detailed
- quality work – looks neat, tidy, not messy
- content should be about the most important thing in your section
- large image
- violence is ok, if important, but cannot be gory
- (spelling correct)

Written Summary

- title
- well-organized (sequence)
- main events
- details that are important
- large enough and neat enough to read (lined paper)
- 6th-grade length
- complete sentences with correct grammar
- correct spelling
- correct punctuation
- correct capitalization
- use quotation marks if a character is speaking

Oral Presentation

- main ideas
- well-organized
- loud enough for everyone to hear
- well-practiced (not memorized! paper or notecards are ok)
- eye contact
- equal participation from partners
- good posture
- gestures as appropriate
- props are optional (1 or 2)

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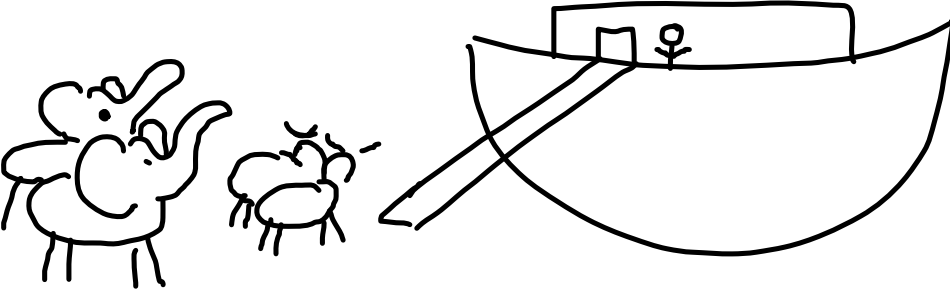
Directions:
